#### **OUR ASPIRATIONS AND VALUES**

#### Accessibility

Our aim is that there should be an 'opportunity for all' to share and benefit from our local heritage and culture. Our aspiration is to create a museum that allows for the widest range of individual needs whether they include for example, mobility, sensory, or language. This can best be achieved by open dialogue with people who have broad first-hand experience.

### Spaces

Our physical spaces provide a rich opportunity to rejuvenate buildings in a phased way. This will systematically integrate, for example accessibility, and reduces the building's environmental impact. Integrating these two aspects will best achieve upgraded facilities for our visitors and care for our collections.

### Museum without Walls

It is our intention that the Museum should be much more than a physical building to house our Collections. Our aspiration is to create changing exhibitions and participatory events that can be shared at the Museum but as importantly around the town and surrounding areas. This can best be achieved in collaboration with others.

# **Diversity and Inclusion**

We believe that museums should create meaningful experiences for people of all origins and background. This is central to their social value. Our aspiration is to truly represent all sections of our community in our Collection, Exhibitions and Projects. Further we aim to create a supportive and inclusive environment where everyone can feel comfortable to be themselves and thrive.





#### **BUILDING OUR VISION**

Chard Museum is a small local museum located in south Somerset. It is housed in a converted 16th century thatched building that were originally four cottages. It later incorporated the building next door which had been the New Inn public house. In the early 1980's the Barn was added.

The foundation of the collection dates from around 1880 when Arthur Hull, a local surveyor, started to collect curiosities. He left these to the town. In 1970 the Museum opened.

Building the Vision (Phase 3) covers the period April 2025 to late 2027. Its focus is on 'taking action' on what we have learnt from Building Resilience: Through Stories and Spaces (Phase 2: 50 Years and Beyond). This was funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund and Archaeological Heritage Fund.

The first two phases of 50 Years and Beyond achieved:

- 50 Years and Beyond: Trustee preparation for the challenges of taking ownership of the Museum buildings and changing our Governance to become a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO)
- Building Resilience through Stories and Spaces: Working with heritage specialists to think about, research and develop what our future vision of the Museum will contain, share and deliver

Phase 3, Building our Vision will unlock the potential in three specific Museum spaces. These are the Patio, to be renamed the Courtyard, the Paddock and the Barn. Community feedback has shown that repurposing would allow us to deliver a decisive impact on our objectives of:

- · Caring for our Heritage
- Improving our Public Offer
- Developing our Audiences
- Widening our Impact

### **OUR VALUES**

#### Caring for our Heritage

Continue to manage our collections and archives through a programme of development and rationalisation. This will ensure a high standard of care and relevance to our future vision and ensure our historic buildings are maintained and secure.

# Improving our Public Offer

Build our visitor and user experience both on, off site and virtually through updated displays, events and exhibition programmes. Develop our schools and groups offer.

### **Developing our Audiences**

Widen our audiences by developing a programme of events, workshops and community led exhibitions that will engage and reach out to local people as well as attract new visitors to the town

### Widening our Impact

Continue to build partnerships with local organisations through projects, events and exhibitions and while improving our external communications and PR. This builds our visibility among key stakeholders, funding organisations and local people

### Strengthening our Sustainability and Resilience

Implement a new business model that increases income through paid admissions, school visits, events and exhibitions. It will generate an operational surplus to assist support for building maintenance and development. Recruit new Trustees and or volunteers to meet the needs identified in our Knowledge and Skills Audit.
